ABOUT US

Vivek Chetana was blessed at the very outset as an organization by Sri Sarada Math and Ramakrishna Sarada Mission. For the last forty years they have shown us the path of service in the light of ideals propounded by Swamiji. Emboldened by the strength of his message and the depth of his vision we dared to take up more and more challenges in order to reach out to physically challenged, economically disadvantaged and marginalized women and children in urban and rural localities. Health, nutrition, hygiene and education were our main areas of focus. Then, extending our reach to facilitate women's need for self – reliance, we are now actively pursuing vocational–training courses for aspiring young adult women and enterprising mothers. Our supplementary coaching programmes for school going children in villages like Gobindapur, Bardeuli and Gangarampur adopt a holistic approach, in that we include arts, music, health and hygiene in our curriculum.

AS WE RECALL . . .

From the small precincts of 2/3 A Keyatala Road, forty years ago Vivek Chetana's members started their selfless service. Teaching children from the slums was their first assignment- at first only three of them. The word spread. Several para children- from classes I to IV came for "Parua" classes. Their seniors "V to X" attended Vidya Vihar at the same location in the evening. For well over 20

years Keyatala hummed with the voice of these students. One of the charming highlights which old timers today recall was 'Amader Janmadin' to hold celebrations for children who could not otherwise celebrate their birthdays at home. The first five years of Vivek Chetana saw the introduction of daily tiffin provided to the students, provision of library, Toy Bank and also making greeting cards under their teacher's supervision.

Along with schooling slum children, in the first year Vivek Chetana ran homeopathic medical Centres in the city – one at Golf Green and other at S. R. Das Road which were well frequented. Vivek Chetana also published a newsletter regularly in support of these efforts.

Swamiji's untiring zeal to inspire youth with the ideals of selfless service and love for fellow citizens prompted Vivek Chetana to hold girl students'/women's conventions where participants could debate and expound on Swamiji's vision for the country's youth and women's progress . These conventions and seminars continued to be organised every year from 1985 to 2005.

In the years that followed the Vivek Chetana members focussed their attention on villages – on coaching, improving hygiene, nutrition of women and children under the Prerona Project. Some names of villages that spring to mind are Tulsighata, Aadirabad and Aarapanch. In the effort to energise and inspire the youth and women with Swamiji's ideals, Vivek Chetana started classes with a purpose of

more holistic education by including Music and Art classes. Adult Literacy classes were also introduced at this time.

Swamiji's dream of an inclusive society motivated Vivek Chetana towards encouraging specially-enabled women in making Paper Packets for sale and learn sewing to attain some amount of self-reliance and independence in their lives. Thus, Kaajer Kagoj and Step Together projects were born. Within the first decade Vivek Chetana started a project for the inmates of Alipur Women's Correctional Home. It was an attempt to supplement their income and provide a source of income in the future. Their hand-embroidered items were very much in demand. We continue to cherish this association and hope that it continues.

Our current practice of providing a small measure of financial assistance to enterprising women in these villages began in the early years. Applicants show an increase every year.

Vivek Chetana strives to be on the lookout for new avenues of improving the lives of deprived women and children. Recently, some skill-based courses are being sponsored for this very purpose.

As Vivek Chetana looks forward to the future, members take the opportunity to express our gratitude to all volunteer workers, sponsors, friends and well-wishers. We humbly thank all our donors for their consistent cooperation and pray for their support in the years to come.

KAAJER KAGOJ

This is a self-help project for severely orthopaedically disabled and economically disadvantaged women. The work of making these paper packets and earning from them provides a much-needed livelihood resource and a small measure of dignity and independence. Vivek Chetana has always been conscious of the need of upholding the dignity as well as of providing some additional support to lonely, deprived, elderly women. In 2019, the Aarta Sahay project was launched for elderly women living in and around Gangarampur village, with funds donated by several sympathetic sponsors. Every month, through volunteers, Vivek Chetana distributes hampers containing items of regular use- like snacks, soap, puffed rice, seasonal fruits, sugar and detergent powder, for their convenience. There are aspirants waiting to enrol for the next session in July, 2025.
